SUNDAY AFTER THE ELEVATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

THE FIRST ANTIPHON

O God, my God, attend to me; why hast Thou forsaken me? Far from my salvation are the words of my transgressions.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

My God, I will cry by day, and wilt Thou not hearken? And by night, and it shall

not be unto folly for me. But as for Thee, Thou dwellest in the sanctuary, O

RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION IN TONE THREE

O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance, granting to Thy people victory over all their enemies, and by the power of Thy Cross preserving Thy commonwealth.

APOLYTIKION OF ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST

O beloved Apostle of Christ God, Come quick and save a people with no recourse. He who let you rest your head on his breast, will not reject your pleas on our behalf. Beseech him then, O wise and holy theologian.

Dispel from us the dark and omanous clouds of disbelief. Grant us all of his peace and great mercy.

KONTAKION OF THE ELEVATION OF THE HOLY CROSS IN TONE FOUR

(**Thou Who wast raised up**)

Do Thou, Who of Thine own good will was lifted up upon the Cross, O Christ our God, bestow Thy bounties upon the new Nation which is called by Thy Name; make glad in Thy might those who lawfully govern, that with them we may be led to victory over our adversaries, having in Thine aid a weapon of peace and a trophy invincible.

THE EPISTLE

(For Sunday after the Elevation of the Holy Cross)

Sing praises to our God, sing praises.

Clap your hands all ye peoples.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Galatians. (2:16-20)

Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ. Even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the Law died to the Law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ Who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, Who loved me and gave Himself for me.

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark. (8:34-9:1)

The Lord said, "If any man would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for My sake and the Gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? For what can a man give in return for his soul? For whoever is ashamed of Me and of My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels." And He said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death be-

fore they see the Kingdom of God come with power."

FORGOTTEN FACTS ABOUT THE HOLY CROSS ELEVATION

he Feast Day of the Elevation of the Holy Cross is an event whose details are engrained in the minds of all Orthodox Christians. We know of the pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 323 AD led by St. Helen - mother of the Emperor Constantine - in search of our Lord's Cross. We know that this feast received its name by virtue of the Cross being "elevated" for all to see by Patriarch Macarius after its discovery. But there are other facts about this blessed event that are often overlooked.

Who told St. Helen to search for the Cross in the place it was found? Tradition tells us that it was a Jew named Jude who advised the Empress. It is said that after the Cross was found, Jude was so overcome by what he witnessed that he was immediately baptized into the Church, taking the name "Cyriacus." He became a zealous follower of Christ - rising quickly to the office of Patriarch of Jerusalem.

What was initially done with the Cross? After its finding, St. Helen remained in Jerusalem, building churches in Gethsemane, Bethlehem and on the Mount of Olives. Her dream was to construct a great church over the place where our Lord was crucified and buried. She never lived to see her dream fulfilled, however, passing on into eternity before the church's completion. It was not until September 13/26, 335 AD that the magnificent Church of the Resurrection was formally consecrated. It coincided with the 30th Jubilee of Constantine's glorious reign as Emperor. The Cross would remain in the Church of the Resurrection for nearly 300 years, when King Chozroes conquered Jerusalem and carried it off to Persia. Fourteen years later, the Emperor Heraclius was able to bring it back to its rightful place in the great cathedral.
